ACAW 2002 | New York

In an unprecedented alliance of curators, museum directors, gallery owners, educators and collectors, the Asian Contemporary Art Consortium (ACAC) announces a full week of programs in New York City dedicated to the exploration of the richness and diversity of Asian and Asian American contemporary art. Most events are free and open to the public, but registration is essential.

The week of events will culminate with a symposium hosted at the Asia Society and Museum on Friday, November 8th and Saturday, November 9th. In this two-day symposium, entitled *Looking Ahead: Dialogues In Asian Contemporary Art*, curators, artists, writers and scholars will explore the themes of art patronage and collecting Asian contemporary art, new forms of curatorship in Asia, transnational artists in the United States, art of the Asian diaspora and the rise of biennials in Asia.

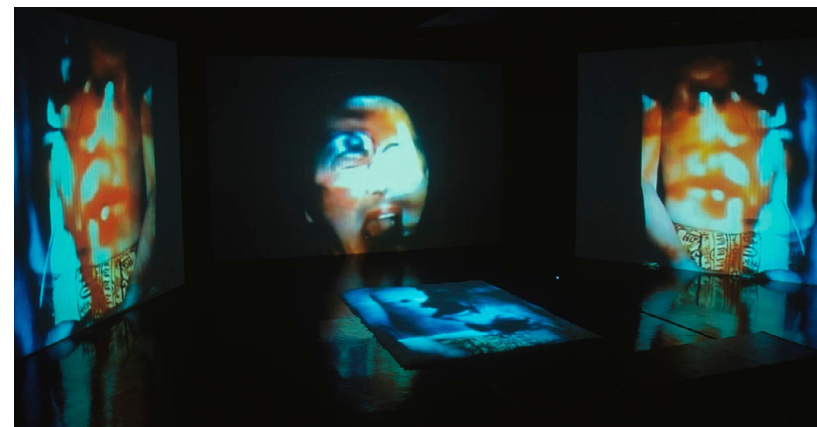

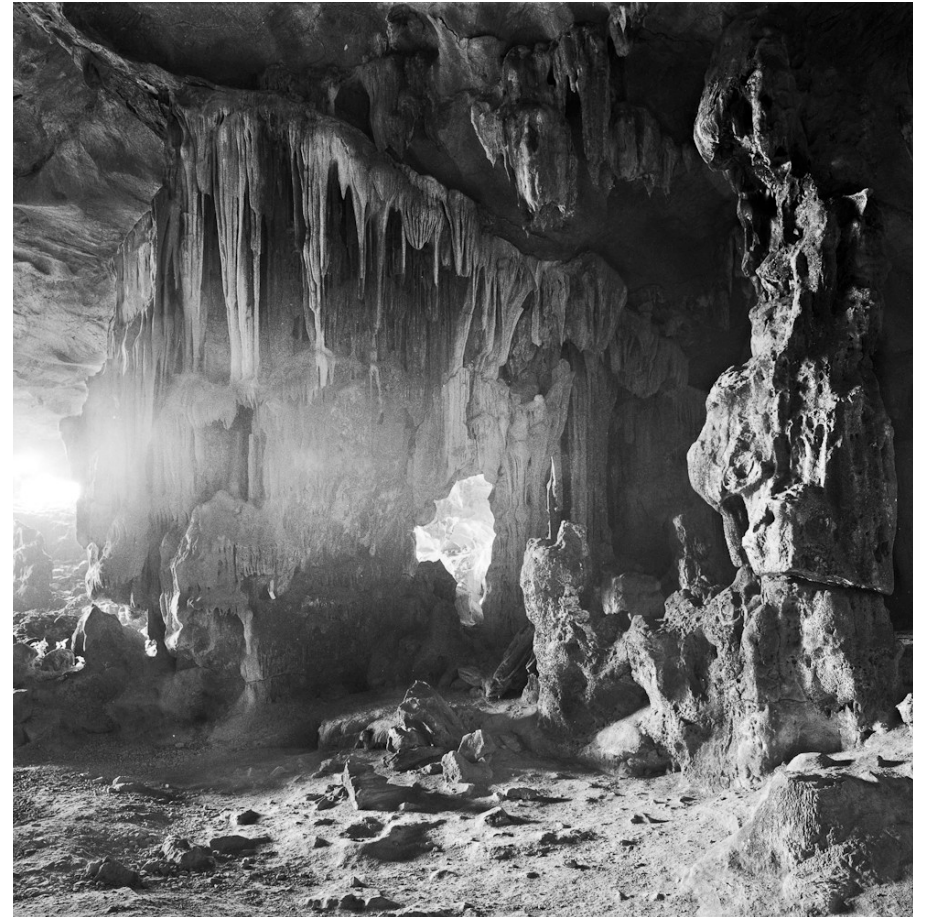

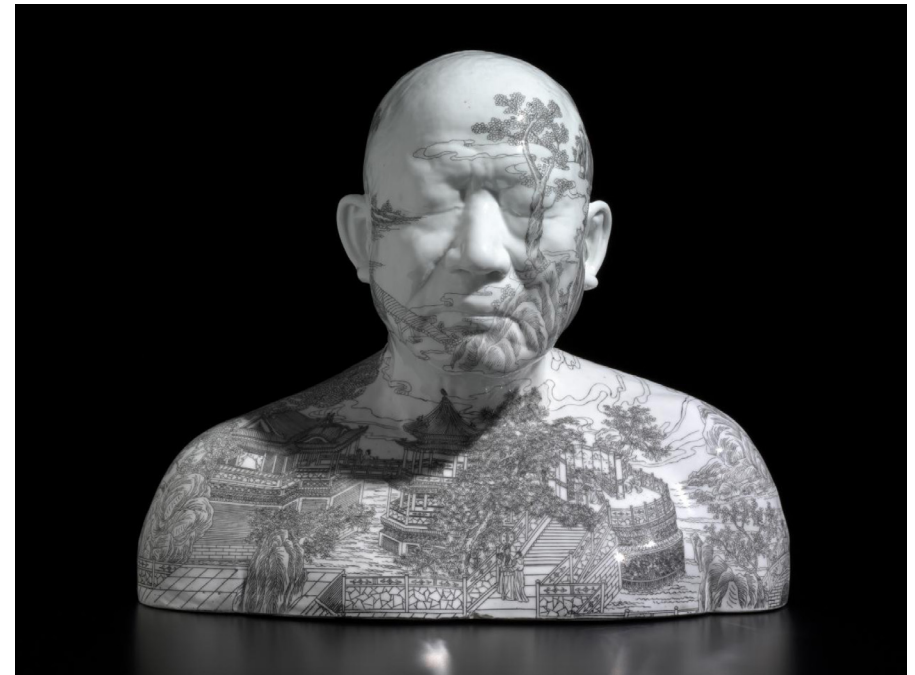

ACAW 2002 Signature Program Open Studios

In the past decade, Asian artists have gained significant attention in the United States, marked by their inclusion in large-scale museum exhibitions, representation by major galleries, and the emergence of new academic fields of study. This symposium seeks to address this recent interest by bringing together curators, writers, collectors and scholars from Asia, the United States and Europe to discuss issues central to Asian contemporary art such as the complexity of Asian transnationalism in Western context; the translation of cultural specificity; and the legacy of plural experiences of modernity. The format of this symposium will be a series of conversations rather than formal papers.

The Open Studios program provides public access to artists living and working across the various boroughs of New York, addressing the growing interest in Asian contemporary art. It complements ACAW's Signature Symposium, which explores the complexity of Asian transnationalism in a Western context, the translation of cultural specificity, and the legacy of plural experiences of modernity.
